



What is ISF?

Founded in 2011 by the private-sector members of OSAC, the nonprofit International Security Foundation (ISF) funds OSAC's training symposia and security information exchanges for OSAC's Country and Common Interest Councils (Regional Councils and Sector-Specific Working Groups).

Why does OSAC need ISF support?

The Federal Advisory Committee Act prohibits OSAC's Country and Common Interest Councils from receiving federal funding. ISF support helps to create a stronger, more responsive OSAC by funding these important OSAC initiatives.

Who supports ISF?

Corporations, organizations, academic institutions, non-profits, NGOs and individuals may support ISF with a tax-deductible donation.
