

This year was an exciting turning point for the ISF. Our 2019 milestones included:

- Reaching more than \$1 million raised through annual dinner sponsorships;
- Creating the first-ever ISF endowment, thanks to the generosity of ISF donors and sponsors; and
- Funding 69 OSAC programs, our highest ever, including 46 Country Council programs – a total of 21 more programs than in 2018.

Our Board of Directors led and embraced a deeper level of engagement in the ISF as well, hosting the first ISF Board retreat in June 2019 and creating our first Strategic Plan and Program Committee. Such forward-focused organizational strides ensure that the ISF is poised and ready for the next step: funding non-OSAC nonprofit organizations with the creation of the ISF grants program.

Our new grants program enhances the vibrancy and resiliency of the global security community by funding the important work of U.S. nonprofits working in the global security field. In addition to these selected grants, the ISF will continue to predominantly fund OSAC programs, information-sharing and networking initiatives.

Announcing the ISF Grants Program

In 2020, the ISF launched a new grants program for U.S. nonprofits with an international security mission. The focus will be on nonprofits with an annual budget less than \$1 million.

The ISF will continue to predominantly support OSAC programming in addition to funding selected nonprofits through an online application process. The creation of the ISF's new grants program is made possible by the generosity of the ISF Board of Directors whose financial support broadens the ISF's impact and support of the global security community.



Making grants to nonprofits in the global security community is an exciting evolution for the ISF. Together, with our ongoing support of OSAC, the ISF can enhance the vital network of private and public organizations working to keep Americans and American interests safer.




