Rebecca's resourcefulness and can-do spirit have helped OSAC's Women in Security (WiS) program grow from its founding in 2017 into a thriving group with membership approaching almost 1,000 women and allies. Rebecca guided the WiS Steering Committee in creating its foundational documents, mission, objectives and organizational structure. She was instrumental in developing WiS's communication strategy and collegial Google Group. A true collaborator, Rebecca helps WiS work in tandem across the Common Interest Committees. In 2020, she helped develop eight WiS webinars and three facilitated virtual events and discussions. She also has been vital to implementing WiS's benchmarking surveys, nascent speaker bank and WiS's most ambitious undertaking to date, a mentor/protégé program.

Reliable, knowledgeable and efficient, Dinesh is the "go-to" person for the OSAC India-Chennai Chapter. He coordinates and leads webinars and chapter meetings and has improved member communications, networking and chapter visibility significantly. He revised the Chapter's WhatsApp communication policy with updated communications standards, creating a common language requirement (English) on WhatsApp that proved essential to coordinate COVID-19 responses in a country with approximately 27 official languages. When the Indian government locked down the country, he developed webinars with business and emergency preparedness experts and conducted quarterly validation studies for members. Among the innovative partnerships he initiated in 2020 is a collaboration with Chennai police. Also last year, after extensive research of statutory information required by Indian law, Dinesh developed and disseminated best-practice requirements.

2020 COMMON INTEREST COMMITTEE ACHIEVEMENT AWARD WOMEN IN SECURITY

Since the initial Women in Security (WiS) networking event in 2017, WiS has become a cornerstone of the OSAC program with nearly 1,000 members of women and allies. WiS focuses on addressing the successes and challenges of women in security and developing impactful networking and essential resources needed to thrive in the industry. In 2020, WiS made impressive strides in fulfilling its mission to encourage female perspectives, leadership, participation and inclusion in OSAC by establishing new subcommittees. The Mentorship Subcommittee's new mentor/protégé program has 50 matched mentoring pairs to date. The Benchmarking Subcommittee's February 2020 survey developed needed demographics to create future programs, while the Speaker Diversity Subcommittee created a directory prototype for Common Interest Committees and OSAC to expand speaker panel diversity. Early in the pandemic, WiS's Webinars and Events Subcommittee and Google Group quickly shared information and benchmarking through 11 virtual events. In addition, the WiS new job posting process is helping the security industry attract diverse candidates.

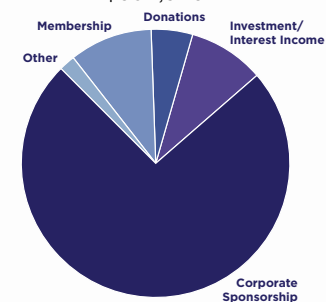

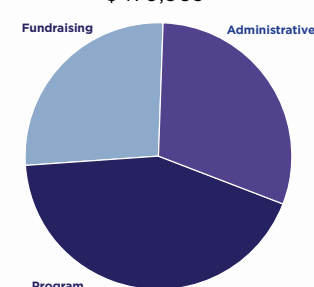
